GO Transit bus fares altered

Commuters using GO Transit on both Yonge Street and Bayview Avenue to the Finch Subway will pay 50 cents for the ride beginning Monday, October

This fare is an increase of 10 cents for Yonge Street users and a decrease of 10 cents for those using the Bayview Service.

The fare change is part of a plan to integrate the local GO services with municipal transit which ultimately, according to G() Transit authorities, should see a common fare structure.

Transfer privileges are provided on both the Yonge Street and Bayview Avenue service to the Richmond Hill

Transit town service.,

Transit Co-ordinator for Richmond Hill, Bud Newton, said it will be a simple procedure to transfer from GO Transit to the local bus, but when transferring the other way, from Richmond Hill Transit to GO Transit, the passenger will be required to pay

the difference. The complete new tariff for GO Transit, Richmond Hill to the Finch Subway, will be adults, 50 cents, students, 35 cents, children and senior citizens, 25 cents.

GO Transit's Bayview bus service will undergo another major change also on October 1.

At that time buses will operate at 30 minute frequency during rush hour and hourly during midday, with no service being provided in evenings or on weekends and holidays.

Routing will also change, with buses travelling down Bayview Avenue only as far south as John Street in Thornhill and cross John Street to Yonge Street, then along Yonge to the terminal at the Finch subway station.

Due to Markham Transit's recently instituted service 773-5651 operating on the same route from Thornlea Secondary School, GO buses will not handle local passengers south of Highway 7.
