Wilson says he'll stand for Liberal post

The York North (Provincial) Liberal Association will hold its nomination meeting in a month, but already the candidates are starting to come forward.

Jim Wilson said this week he will seek the position at the meeting, slated for November 15, at the Aurora High School.

Since running in the 1977 provincial election as the candidate for York North, many pressing issues have developed, he said.

"During the last election, much of my time was spent gaining recognition throughout the Riding," he said. "Now that people know me, this election will be fought on the present government's record."

Mr. Wilson said the time has come for Ontario to reconsider its stand on automatically electing a Conservative government.

"The present one has become stagnant and complacent and Mr. Davis is making noises about the energy problems," Mr. Wilson said. "Well, Mr. Davis should have thought about that years ago. Millions of the Ontario taxpayers' dollars have been wasted by this party at Queen's Park."

Mr. Wilson said that as the Liberal representative for York North at Queen's Park, "I will deal with your problems promptly and you will have an MLA who will represent all the people in the riding."
