GO BUS SCHEDULE CHANGES OCTOBER 28

"A" BUSES will operate on Yonge Street to Highway 401, then across to the new GO Transit Bus Terminal at Yorkdale. This will provide connections from the northern corridor to the subway; to GO Buses coming to the Yorkdale Terminal from Oshawa, Brampton/Georgetown/Guelph, and Milton; and to a number of inter-city buses which will also be using the new GO Bus Terminal.

As part of this change, "A" Buses will now also pick up and discharge passengers between Markham Road and Steeles Avenue.

One or two round trips a day will continue to operate to the Elizabeth St. Terminal in downtown Toronto but will run via Avenue Road south of Yorkdale.

"A" Buses will continue to serve the Richmond Hill GO Station on Newkirk Road and will provide better connecting timing with weekday GO Trains to Union Station.

"B" BUSES between Newmarket and Finch Subway will no longer route via the Richmond Hill GO Station on Newkirk Road but will stay on Yonge Street for their entire journey. This will improve running time to the Finch Subway by about five minutes.

HWY 400 EXPRESS More trips will terminate and originate at Yorkdale. Weekday express trips leaving Newmarket Terminal at 0650 (0630 from Bradford), 0735 and the 0735 King Express will terminate at Yorkdale while northbound trips will originate at Yorkdale at 1615 (via King to Sutton), 1645, 1730 (to Bradford) and 1800. Express trips will no longer travel south of the Elizabeth St. Terminal in downtown Toronto.
