Refugees allowed to attend York's Separate Schools

York Region's separate school board is waiving some of its enrollment restrictions in an effort to ensure that Indo-Chinese refugees can attend Roman Catholic schools.

number of conditions are met.

Refugees must be sponsored by a separate school supporter or Roman Catholic church organization; they must live in a home paying separate school taxes; and live with a family whose children attend the region's separate schools.

Education Director John Zupancic said he expects up to two dozen Indo-Chinese may decide to attend one of York's Roman Catholic schools.

There were a number of reasons for the board's change of policy.

The motion, brought forth by Mr. Zupancic following a meeting in Toronto with Emmett

Cardinal Carter, points out that refugee children will require instruction and parents will not be able to pay either school fees or taxes.

The change in board policy will be temporary until refugees obtain employment and are able to support themselves. "They aren't taxpayers but their children still have to get schooling," Mr. Zupancic said in an interview.

"It's a situation where we have to be a little bit charitable," he added.

Once the sponsorship of refugees has ended, non-Catholic families wishing to send their children to separate schools will have to pay fees.

Sundays and holidays "C" buses will be diverted off Yonge Street to serve the Newkirk GO station hourly from 6 a.m. until 12 midnight.

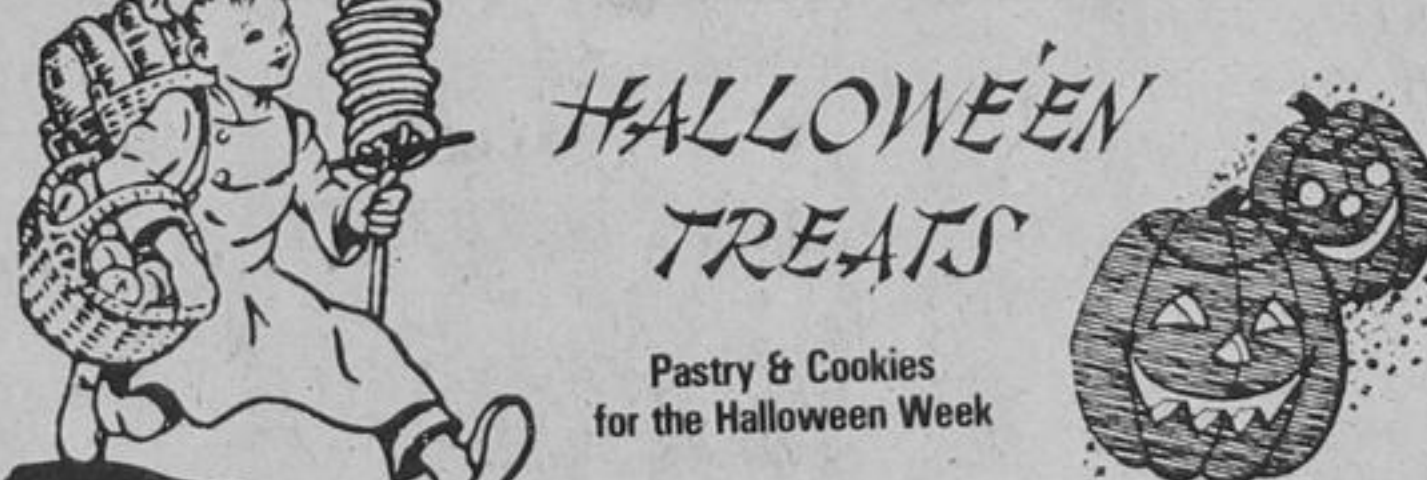
