

Ministry wants boards to use core - concepts

The York Region Roman Catholic Separate School Board and the York County Board of Education have both received approval of Education Provincial to build new schools in the same area.

The Separate School Board will be built in Milliken Mills and the Public School in the Risebrough subdivision, which is in the same area.

In the letter from the Ministry, both boards were asked to consider a 'core-concept' school as an alternative to the permanent structures asked for.

A 'core-concept' is a central building housing administration, a gymnasium, library resource centre, one or two specialized areas (science lab etc.) and a few classrooms. Other portable or relocatable classrooms would be attached to the core.

According to Ed Joyce, Superintendent of Business and Finance for the Separate School Board, it costs seven to nine dollars less for the portable units than it does for a brick and mortar structure, per square foot.

What this means is the core would still cost the same as building a new school per square foot. The only savings would be in the portables.

The advantages of the 'core-concept' lie in the relocatable classrooms, which can be moved to another location if the population predictions change. Portable units can also be added if the need arises.

The Separate School Board has requested a meeting with John Storey, Regional Director of Education, this week to discuss exactly how much money is available, and once the figure is known, it can plan for the type of building for the new school.

Hopes are still high that the new Milliken Mills school will be a permanent structure, because it will be the first Separate School in the area, and the population growth predictions at least continued growth, at least for the next 10 years.

York County Board also expects to meet with Mr. Storey to discuss basically the same items. It wants to know the exact amount of funding available for the Risebrough School and is prepared to show population growth predictions and the need for a permanent structure.

Both Boards are prepared to consider the 'core-concept' but only if there is no other alternative.

Deadline Saturday for parade entries

"We hope this is the year our community business and professional citizens will select to give us their very best support," said Mr. Gallant. "The parade is going to be a great spectacle for the children."
