

St. Robert's wins volleyball honors

St. Robert's High School had most of the answers last week in the York County Midget, Junior and Senior volleyball championships.

They won the midget championship and finished second in the junior championship and, as a result, will be

represented in both categories at the Georgian Bay championships tomorrow (Thursday) at George Banting Memorial High School in Alliston.

Sutton, who defeated St. Robert's in the junior championship, will also go to the Georgian Bay competitions.

It was the first time St. Robert's has ever been represented by two teams at the Georgian Bay championships.

Also making the trek to Alliston will be Langstaff Secondary School of Richmond Hill who finished second to Stouffville in the senior finals.

The midget bracket

saw St. Robert's edging Bayview Secondary School of Richmond Hill in the opening round robin. Both teams had win-loss records of 7-1 but the nod went to St. Robert's via a point spread having split games with one another.

Semi-final play saw St. Robert's defeating Woodbridge 15-10, 15-11, and Markham District High School winning over Bayview 15-12, 15-9. St. Roberts then downed Markham in the finals 15-4, 15-8. Jeff Volpe of St. Robert's was voted the most valuable player by the coaches.

The junior competitions saw St. Robert's off to a flying start winning its round robin eight games to nothing and then defeating Stouffville in the semi-finals.

This was one of the most exciting and gruelling games ever (it took two hours to play) with St. Robert's prevailing 14-16, 15-12, 15-13. Sutton then won the championship finals 15-10, 15-9. Dave Matys of St. Robert's was chosen the most valuable player.

The senior division saw Langstaff winning its zone handily with 10 victories and no losses. They then defeated St. Robert's in semi-finals 15-10, 15-9. They lost the finals to Stouffville 15-2, 11-15, and 15-13. Chris Kamp of Stouffville was the most valuable player.
