The action was taken and the York County Board of Education could not see eye to eye on the conditions of the tentative agreement already rejected by the teachers in September.

The major issue for the teachers is staffing in the elementary schools. The teachers feel that unless the staffing ratio is substantially improved, the educational programs of the Board may be jeopardized.

"The introduction of the elementary school French program and the increase in special education classes have both had adverse effects of a slide, on class size," say the teachers.
