

Police Briefs

An 18-year-old Markham man has been arrested and charged with 11 counts of break, enter and theft and seven counts of break and enter with intent to commit theft as a result of recent police investigations.

The accused was arrested in Newmarket and questioned about several break and enters, and admitted to break ins since the beginning of September at the following: Hillcrest Snack Bar, Milliken Farms, Weall and Cullen Nurseries (3 times), Hilltop Fruit Market (twice), Ontario Equipment Limited, Munex Limited, Frontenac Mechanical Corporation, Modern Rail and Metal Craft, Weldon and McEachen Construction Limited, Richmond College, Mayfair Mechanical Products, Delco Tool and Die Company Limited and Action Communications Limited.

All the break-ins were in the Milliken area. In most instances he took cash, liquor, lottery tickets or cigarettes.

MORE BREAK INS

Two more residents of Unionville have been arrested and charged with break, enter and theft and possession of stolen goods under \$200 as a result of a series of investigations into break ins in the Markham and Unionville areas since December 1978.

The accused are 16 and 18 years old and are charged with break ins at the Unionville House Restaurant and Markham Truck and Auto Wreckers.

HOUSEBREAKINGS

There have been several housebreakings in the Thornhill-Markham area in the last week.

On November 7 a quantity of jewelry was taken from the residence of Norman Vernon of Linden Lee Street, Markham.

Also on November 7 someone broke into the home of Sheila Leng of Newton Gate, Markham and took jewelry and a camera.

A gold pocket watch was taken from the home of Heather Reid of Boran Way, Thornhill in a break in on November 8.

The majorettes are sponsored by the Richvale Lions, who cannot afford to finance the entire trip for the girls.
