

Regional Police Briefs

A 16-year-old Thornhill man has been charged with failing to remain, dangerous driving and driving without an operator's licence.

On November 14 at John Street and Henderson Avenue, Thornhill, the vehicle driven by the accused spun around several times and almost struck a pedestrian.

The driver then lost control of the vehicle and struck a hydro pole before the vehicle ended up in a ravine resting against a tree.

The accused fled the scene and was later arrested in the Thornhill area.

He will appear in court December 11.

INDECENT EXPOSURE

A Thornhill man has been arrested and charged with indecent exposure as a result of an investigation into an incident which occurred November 13 on Henderson Avenue, Thornhill.

An 11-year-old female was walking along the street, when a vehicle pulled up next to her.

When she looked inside the car, the accused was committing an indecent act.

The accused has been summonsed for court December 11.

BREAK AND ENTERS

An 18-year-old Toronto man has been charged with break, enter and theft and break and enter with intent to commit theft as a result of investigations into several break-ins in the Markham area.

The victims are all in an industrial complex on Esna Park Road in Markham.

They are Mr. CB, Hart's Upholstery and Yolles Furniture.

Police officers responded to the Mr. CB location on November 16 when the burglar alarm was sounded. They found the accused on the premises and he had in his possession items taken from Yolles Furniture.

Further investigation revealed he was responsible for the break-in at Hart's Upholstery.

He appeared for a show cause hearing the same day.

POPPY FUND

A 17-year-old Milliken man has been arrested

and charged after someone took money from the Remembrance Day collection box at the Dairy Queen Store in Markham.

LADIES ROOM?

Someone entered the ladies washroom at the Regent Gas Bar on Woodbine Avenue, Markham and smashed a hole in the wall leading to the office.

Six hundred dollars was taken.

BUNNIES AND WHISKERS

Someone entered a shed on the property of Bert Smith, 212 Garden Avenue, Thornhill and took a goat and 10 rabbits.

The missing livestock is valued at \$150.

Resident will be sentenced later in week

A 24-year-old Thornhill resident, William Hazelwood of Inverloch Blvd., will appear in court this week for sentencing after he entered a guilty plea last week to a charge of failing to remain at the scene of an accident in December 1978.

The incident occurred at about 11 p.m. on December 11, when 20-year-old Mark Dana Foote of Colborne Avenue, Richmond Hill was struck by a vehicle on Bayview Avenue south of Markham Road.

Mr. Foote was pronounced dead at York Central Hospital and autopsy results showed the cause of death to be injuries received in the accident.

Mr. Hazelwood had his van sold the next day for scrap, and investigation by police showed it to be the vehicle involved in the hit and run accident.

Mr. Hazelwood was wanted by police for another reason, when he was apprehended. Sentencing will be today in Toronto.
