Boynton Meats, a meat packing plant in Victoria Square, operating for more than 75 years of being passed through generations of sons, is now flourishing with a woman's touch.

Vicky Boynton does all the buying, pricing and selling for the butchering business selling both retail and wholesale, as well as the things which fall on the shoulders of any small business owner - in this case, climbing on the roof to check the compressor a couple of times and often lifting

orders up to 100 pounds for customers.

Strangely enough, it was not squeamishness which presented a problem to Mrs. Boynton; it was dealing with salesmen, who were unfamiliar with dealing with women in this particular field.

Besides the butchering of meat and meat sales, Boynton Meats do custom killing, under strict government inspection, for local farmers.

specialty butchering, and even individual smoking and curing, the old fashioned way in the smokehouse on the premises, are all becoming part and parcel
