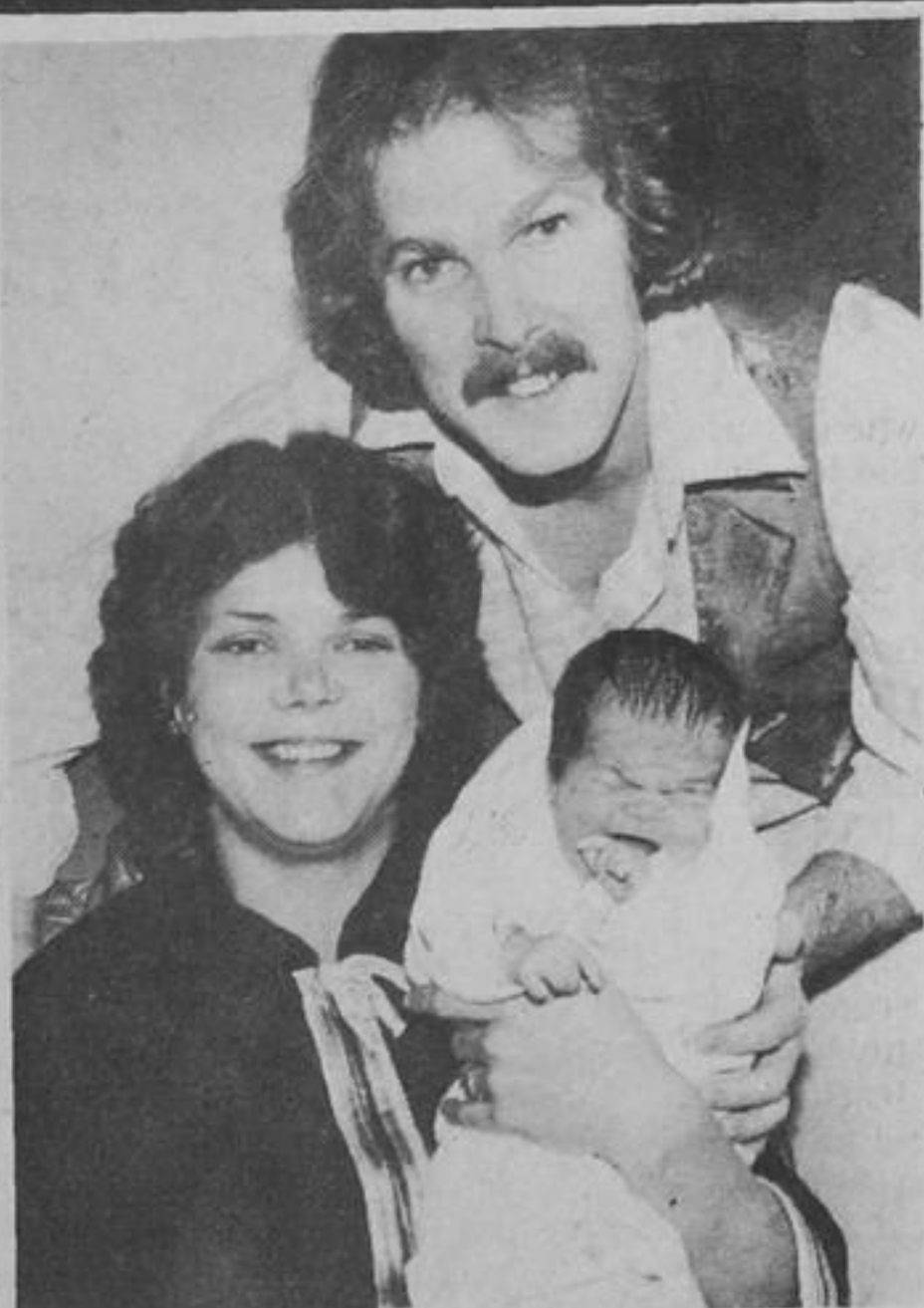


# Parents demand better school facilities

A delegation of 60 parents from the Woodbridge and Pine Valley area demanded action at last week's meeting of the York Region Separate School Board.

The parents complained about crowded conditions in existing schools and are seeking approval of a new school for Pine Valley.

St. Peter's School in Woodbridge is overcrowded with 763 pupils in a school with a capacity of 617. Eleven portables are required to handle the overflow.

The parents are concerned because children freeze in the winter and roasts in the summer when they must attend classes in the portables.

Overcrowded conditions in the parking lot have caused an expansion into the children's playground, parents told the board.

They complained it wasn't fair to the children, who also learn while they are playing. The delegation was angry because approval has been granted for a new school in Milliken

Mills but they still have to wait for approval for a new school in their community.

Four and five year old children are being bussed more than 13 kilometers to a school rented by the Separate School Board.

## Hodgson runs again for York-North post

Bill Hodgson will be back when York North Progressive Conservatives pick their candidate next year, and Lou Rice will be back to mobilize area Tories behind Mr. Hodgson.
