

York Police Briefs

A 17-year-old Toronto man has been arrested and charged with several counts of break, enter and theft as a result of police investigations into several Thornhill break-ins.

On November 8 the residence of Heather Reid was broken into and a quantity of jewelry was taken.

On November 29 the residence of Douglas Smale was also broken into and jewelry and coins were taken.

Jewelry and cash were taken in a November 29 break-in at the home of Ronald Hill, 47 Bowman Avenue, Thornhill.

MORE ARRESTS

Police have arrested two men in another series of break-ins in the Thornhill area.

The first, a 19-year-old, is charged with two counts of possession over \$200 and theft under \$200 as a result of break-ins at the home of Stephen Wong, 62 Niles Way, Thornhill and Heather Reid, 53 Bowman Way, Thornhill.

The second, a 16-year-old, is charged with possession under \$200, when he was found in possession of jewelry from the November 13 break-in at the home of Stephen Wong.

Both will appear in court December 18.

INDECENT ASSAULT

A 52-year-old Richmond Hill man has been arrested and charged with gross indecency, indecent assault male and contributing to juvenile delinquency.

On November 17, a 15-year-old male was taken to a Richmond Hill apartment, given liquor and forced to receive indecent assaults.

A police investigation showed the accused to be responsible.

He will appear in court today.

PARKING LOT THEFTS

On the evening of December 5-6 three Thornhill residents had items taken from their vehicles, which were parked in underground parking lots.

Brian Hunt, 50 Inverlochy Blvd. is missing a Pioneer AM-FM cassette stereo valued at \$500.

Stephen Hutton of 60 Inverlochy Blvd. is missing two stereo speakers and a CB antenna valued at \$283 and Elizabeth Harris of the same address, lost a Pioneer AM-FM cassette stereo valued at \$425 when someone took them from vehicles parked in the underground garage.

MORE THORNHILL ARRESTS

York Regional Police arrested three Thornhill men and charged them with break, enter and theft and possession of stolen goods over \$200 as a result of continued investigations into recent break-ins in the Thornhill area.

The accused includes one 17-year-old and two aged 16.

The break-ins occurred on December 6 at the home of Cecil Wood, 129 Arnold Avenue and on the same date at the home of James Ellies, 170 Arnold Avenue.

On December 6, police observed a vehicle parked near 129 Arnold Avenue, and watched as the accused transported stolen property to the vehicle and then left the scene.

All three were arrested at different locations later on the same day.

Parents were notified and the accused will appear in court today.

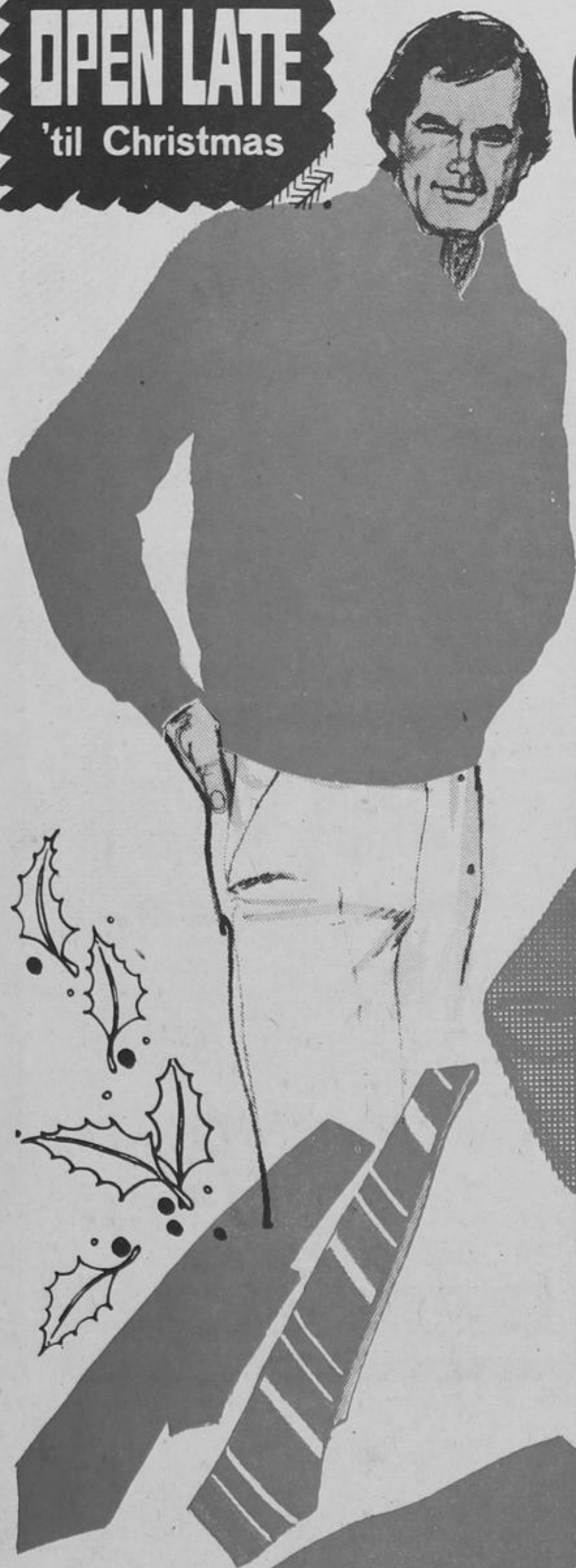

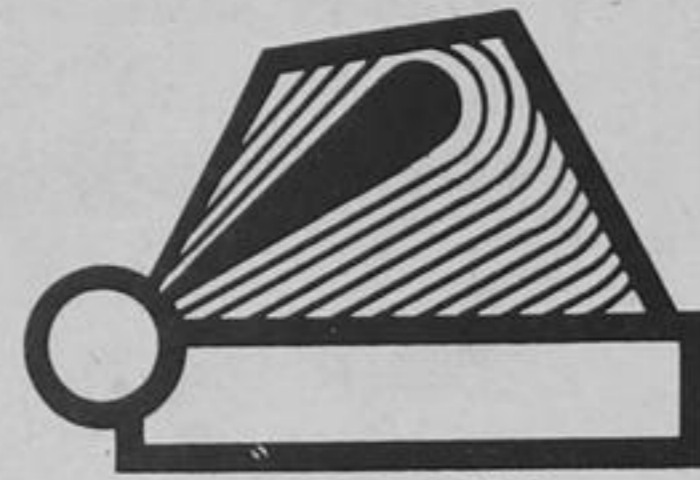

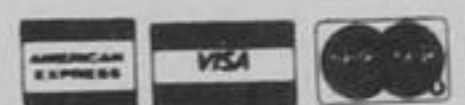
