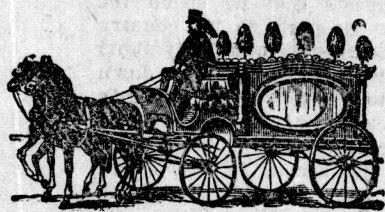

He rendered this very difficult music admirably, notwithstanding the strain it must be to make the quick change of inflection necessary for the change of tone. The unusual nature of his voice made it exceedingly popular with the audience.

After a selection by the orchestra the concert was brought to a close by the National Anthem.

The accompaniments of the evening were ably rendered by Miss Dunne, Prof. Jones and Mr. Jas. Groves.

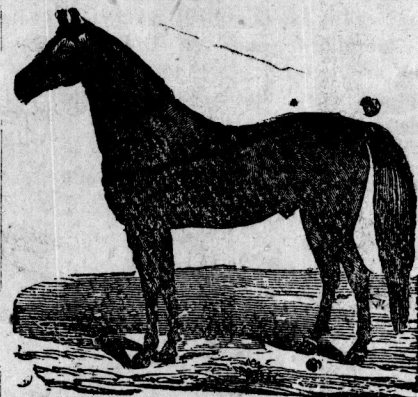
