As announced in last week's Leader, a meeting was held in the Two Mac's Hall on Friday evening to discuss the question of getting something done this coming summer on the road south from this village to the Winchester boundary to connect up with the highway at the bridge and at the boundary.

The attondance was not as large as could be expected, but what was lacking in numbers was made np in entnusiasm.

Quite a number from Marionville, including Rev. Fr. Olivier. were present, to endorse any and all efforts tending towards the hastening of work on the road,

Mr. J. A. Gemble occupied the chair, and Mr, C, F. McArthur acted as secretary.

Brief addresses were given by Rev. Fr. Olivier, Adelard Marion, Mederic Marion, Geo, Dagenais, Geo. Sutherland, Stanley Stephenson, Dr. Macdougall, Robt. Fraser plate. and others.

Mr. O, F. McArthur, secretary of the committee, submitted a copy of the proposed resolutions, and each one as it was read was lm. mediately endorsed by the crowd. Every man present was fully aware of what the road would mean to him personally, and thus being alive to its advantages, were in favor of any method which will help to better conditions.

In closing, Fr. Oiivier referred to the unanimous spirit which prevailed amongst the people at both ends of the read, and expressep his pleasure that both races could work so harmoniously for a along with them, common cause.
