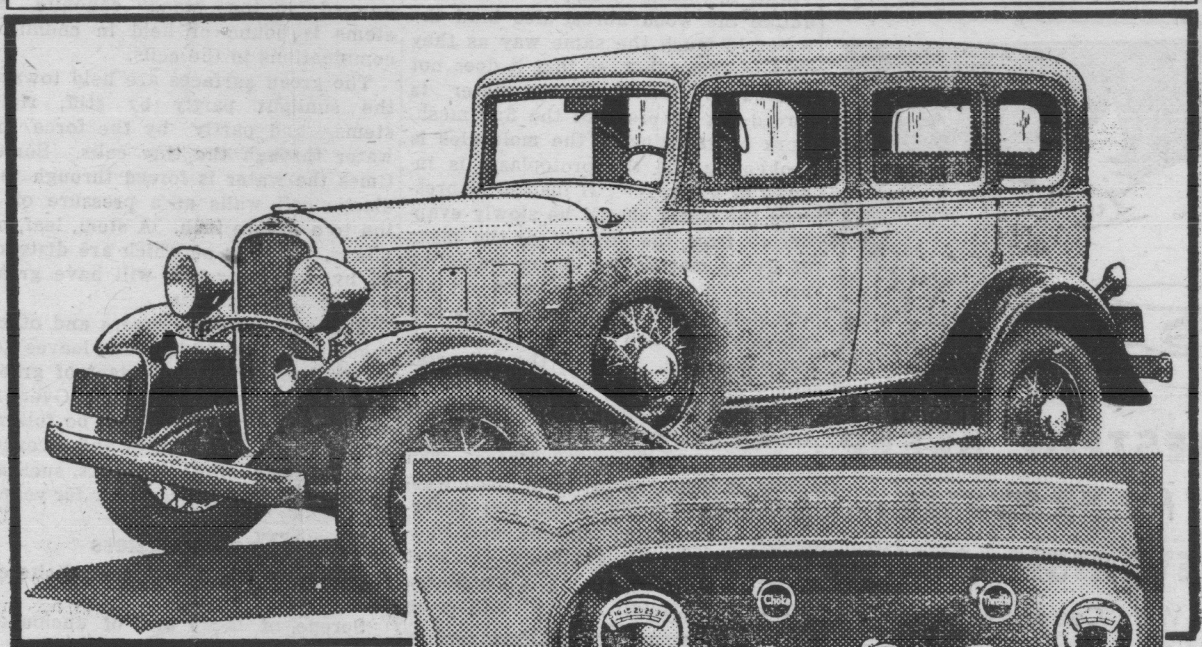

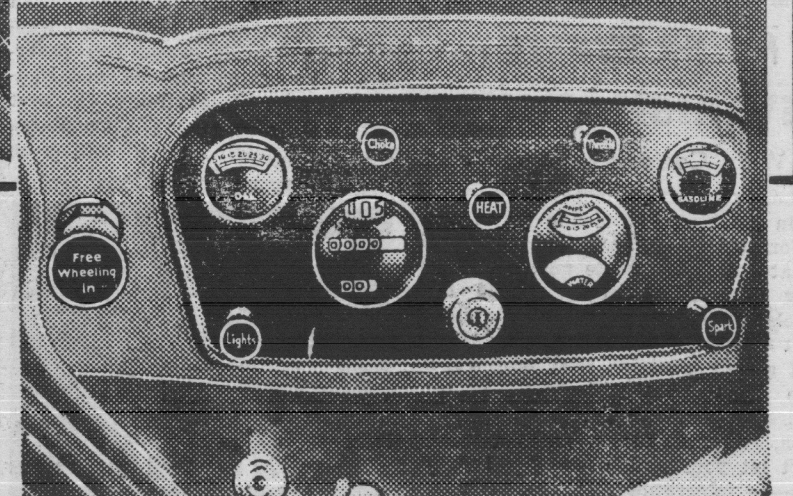

1932 Chevrolet Shows Many Advancements



THE SPECIAL SEDAN

This 1932 Chevrolet special sedan, typical of the models just presented to the public, shows the new lines of beauty which are characteristic. The effect of stream-lining is noticed, and also the new front end, with doors in hood, single-piece bumper, double tie-bar, dual horns. In the lower picture is shown the instrument panel. Notice the free-wheeling control button. It is announced that the 1932 Chevrolet engine is 20 per cent. greater in power and there are many other mechanical improvements, the chief



of which is the combination of synchro-mesh transmission with simplified free-wheeling for the first time in any car as standard equipment.
