COACHING CLASSES AND COMPETITIONS FOR FARM GIRLS IN PRESCOTT AND RUSSELL COUNTIES

The Women's Institutes Branch is again this year organizing coaching classes and competitions in Household Science for farm girls.

The coaching classes and competitions for Prescott and Russell will be held as follows; For Russell County coaching classes on July 3rd. and 4th. at Leonard and competition on July 15th at the same place. For Prescott County; coaching classes on July 5th. and 6th. at Vankleek Hill and competition at same place on July 14th.

During the coaching classes the girls will be trained and they will be asked to coach other girls in their district and bring back for the competition a team of their own. At those competitions the County team for the Intercounty Household Science Judging Competition at the C. C. E. will be selected.

I hope that a large number of farm girls will take advantage of these courses which will be held at a time of the year when it is very convenient for them to attend.

Miss Ethel Rivington, Departmental Coach, of Navan, will have charge of these coaching classes and competitions.
