But Standard Of Excellence Maintained. Famed British Band Coming. Prize Lists Ready

Cofident that the Ottawa Ex. in all its varied departments for this year will attain a standard of excellence not previously equalled, the directors decided to reduce the admission fee in order to give all an opportunity of attending. The general admission has been reduced from 35 cents to 25, and the coupon ticket will be six instead of five for \$1.00. These coupon tickets are now available at the exhibition office for those who wish to resell them, and may be purchased by the public either at the Ex. office or at many stores and business places. Outside the city, these coupon tickets will be on sale at the various branches of the Bank of Nova Scotia and at a number of general stores.

The Ex. will open on Monday, August 21, and already many entries have been received. Owing to the fact that the Ottawa Winter Fair was regional, some have the impression the same rule applies to the exhibition. This in not the case, however, as entries will be received from any place, in fact competition is open to the world. Prize lists will be sent on request.

Attractions obtained are of the highest order.

Goop band music for a number of years has been an outstanding factor of the Ottawa Ex. and has attracted thousands of music lovers each day. This year the directors have been fortunate in being able to obtain the band of His Majesty's Scots Guards, which comes by special permission of His Majesty the King. The band toured Canada in 1912 and 1922 and on each

occasions received a wonderful ovation. To-day the band of the Scots Guards stands pre-eminent and may be looked upon as one of the leading bands of the British Empire. At the present time the band is under personal direction of Lieut. Dowell, who has been in charge of this organization since 1928. Concerts will be given each afternoon and evening of the first four days of the Ex, by this famed band, no extra charge being made. With this band will come four Highland dancers and a piper, the champion of Scotland.

For the last two days of Ex. week, concert programs will be given by the Black Watch Band, Montreal, under Capt. Jones. This is one of Canada's leading bands.

The band of the Governor General's Foot Guards will play each afternoon and evening in connection with the grand stand programs.

Arrangements have been made with the railway companies and the bus lines for reduced fares to Ottawa for Exhibition week. Rates are as low as they have been in years, and thousands, no doubt will avail themselves of this opportunity to visit Canada's largest one week ex. For those who plan to go by car there is provided in the ex. grounds ample space for parking.
