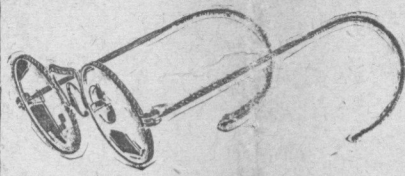
Miss Frances Warner is spending a few holidays at Nepean
