2 cups brown sugar

2 eggs

2 tsp. baking soda


1 tsp. salt

Drop on cookie sheet, flatten or leave as hermits. Bake at 375 - 400 degrees, 10 to 12 minutes.


This recipe won a first prize at the Russell Fair in 1976.
