FITNESS TESTING HERE

The Russell R.A. has been fortunate enough to book the Winario Fitness testing van on Saturday, July 15.

The fitness testing station will be here to promote fitness through recreational activity.

Tests will be about one hour long for each person and will include resting heart beat, resting blood pressure, electrocardiogram under sub-maximum stress, girth and skin fold measurements, flexibility, upper body strength, as well as abdominal strength and a pulmonary function test.

In addition to receiving the

results, each person tested will receive a fitness program tailored to his or her capacity. The personal program is designed to increase the level of fitness.

The cost of this program is \$60.00. But, good news, Wintario picks up most of the tab. The cost per person is only \$12.00.

This is an excellent opportunity for each of you to have a scientific evaluation of your fitness level.
