Russell Fire Brigade report

With the onset of winter, many residents in the area have invested in auxiliary heating systems. However, wood burning stoves, with their obvious economic advantages and rustic appeal, can initiate destructive house fires. The Russell fire

department was recently called to extinguish a fire caused by improper stove placement. Although the damage was minimal, common sense and conformance to the building code could have prevented this mishap. Those interested in installing a wood

burning stove are urged to obtain, free of charge, a copy of "Heating with Wood Safely" available from Central Mortgage and Housing in Ottawa.

For the first time in many years, a budget was submitted to, and approved by the Russell Township Council. This has allowed the upgrading of the present facilities and procurement of equipment which will increase the departments' efficiency and capabilities. The new equipment includes a rescue saw, a portable pump, safety clothing and a liner for the existing cistern, increasing the water storage to approximately 12,000 gallons.

Members of the brigade are presently distributing fluorescent orange stickers displaying the Russell Fire Dept. telephone number. Each household in the area will receive sufficient stickers for their needs. Upon receipt, you are urged to place the sticker near the phone where it is easily seen.

On a parting note, the fire chief and all the fire fighters, would like to wish everyone a safe and very Merry Christmas.
