

### New Osgoode fire numbers

The Osgoode Township Fire Department is endeavouring to serve its residents better through improved communications. The department now has two telephone emergency numbers for the complete township: 821-2121 is to be used as first choice for the eastern section of the township and 826-2424 as first choice for the western section. In cases where any difficulty is experienced reaching the first choice number, the other number can be used.

A new internal communication system has recently been installed in all departmental vehicles and a pager system is also being used by some volunteers at each of our four stations. The Osgoode Volunteer Firefighters Association has undertaken a project to raise \$4,000, for the purchase of additional pager units. This will improve response time in cases of emergency and will not mean an increase in tax dollars having to be used for this purchase.

The Association is presently organizing an Auction Sale to be held in late spring to raise this money. We would appreciate donations of any items which may be sold at this auction.
