### MEDITORIAL



# RUSSELL SEWER SYSTEM HOOK UP NOW!

All Russell Village residents:

Please be advised that you must connect to the newly-installed sanitary sewage system between Aug. 1, 1979, and Aug. 1, 1980.

Permits are available at the Russell Township municipal offices, Embrun, at a cost of \$10 per connection.

All property owners will be levied for the service after Aug. 1, 1980 regardless of whether they have connected to the system.

All connections must be tested and approved by a township inspector.

The rate of levy will be announced soon.
