Metcalfe curling alive

Developments are pleasing club president Bob Reynolds.

"I'm very happy with the way in which the club has stuck together during these disruptions," he said. "Clearly members feel as much a part of the club now as they did at the start of the season."

The club has negotiated ice time twice a week at Ottawa's Lansdowne Park and once a week at Manotick and Russell. Mr. Reynolds said, while one or two of the 100 members have not been

Since November, the club has been working at fundraising and awaiting news from Wintario. Recently, it received word of an enrichment grant from the provincial lottery, two-thirds of the money necessary to rebuild the club to the same dimensions as before.
