Today's dog behaviorists tell us that the bond between our domestic dogs and humans must be forged within the first twelve weeks of the puppy's life or he will never fully trust people and will behave more like a wild animal, shy and unresponsive to training. Fortunately, this rarely happens as puppies are so irresistable at that age.

This is not to suggest that the change from wolf to dog occurred in one generation, but through years of association with man some of the animals adapted through heredity and environment to a stage where they preferred human company to that of their own family, or pack.

Through these years man also developed uses, and no doubt, affection for his four-footed friends, began feeding them regularly and including them as part of the family.
