Recipe of the Month

Johnny Cake

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease an 8" square pan. Combine and set aside: 1 cup cornmeal, ½ cup milk. Sift: 11/4 cups flour (whole wheat flour makes this more nourishing), 2½ tsp. baking powder, 1

tsp. salt. Cream: ½ cup shortening. Beat in: ½ cup honey (or sugar). Add sifted dry ingredients, alternating with 1 egg, 1 cup milk.Blend in cornmeal mixture.

Turn into prepared pan. Bake at 350 degrees F. for 40-45 minutes or until cake springs back when lightly touched. Cool 5 minutes then remove from pan.

Serve buttered, either hot or cold.
