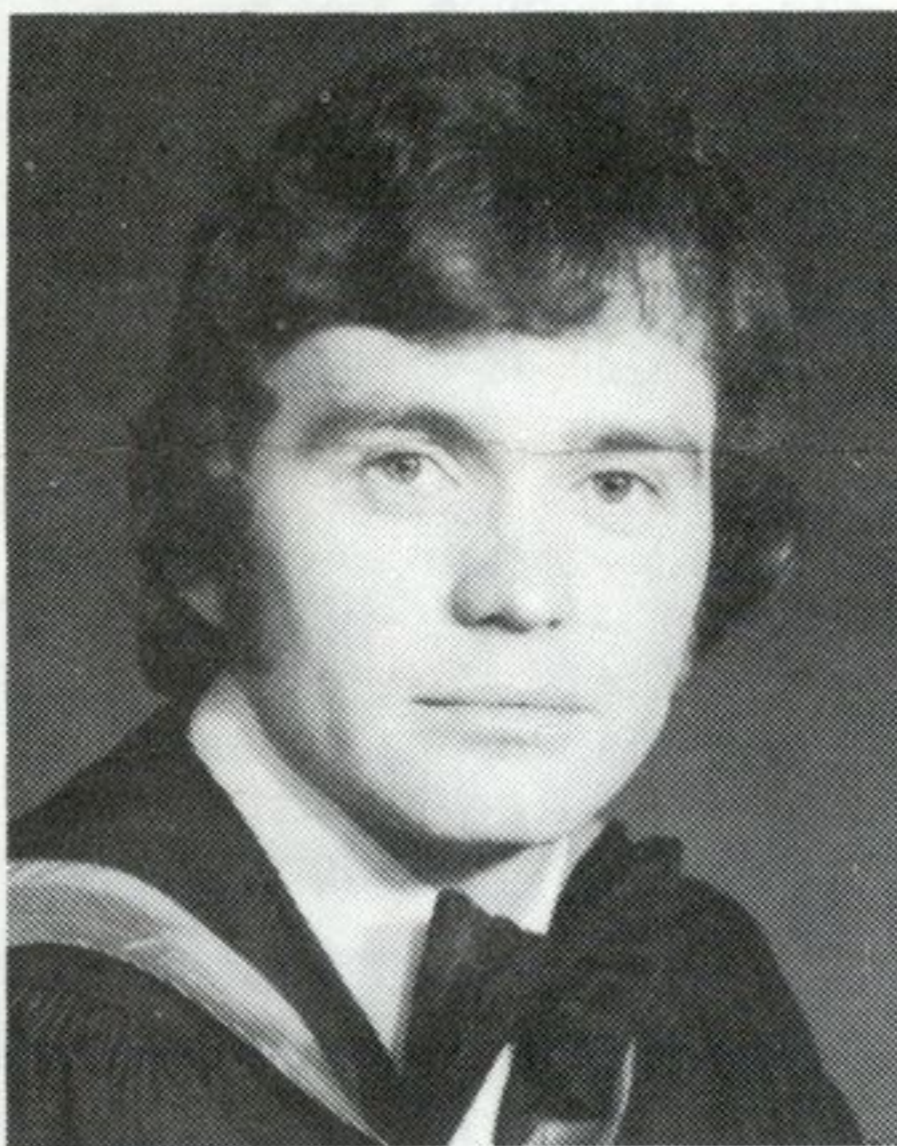
Birth Announcements
