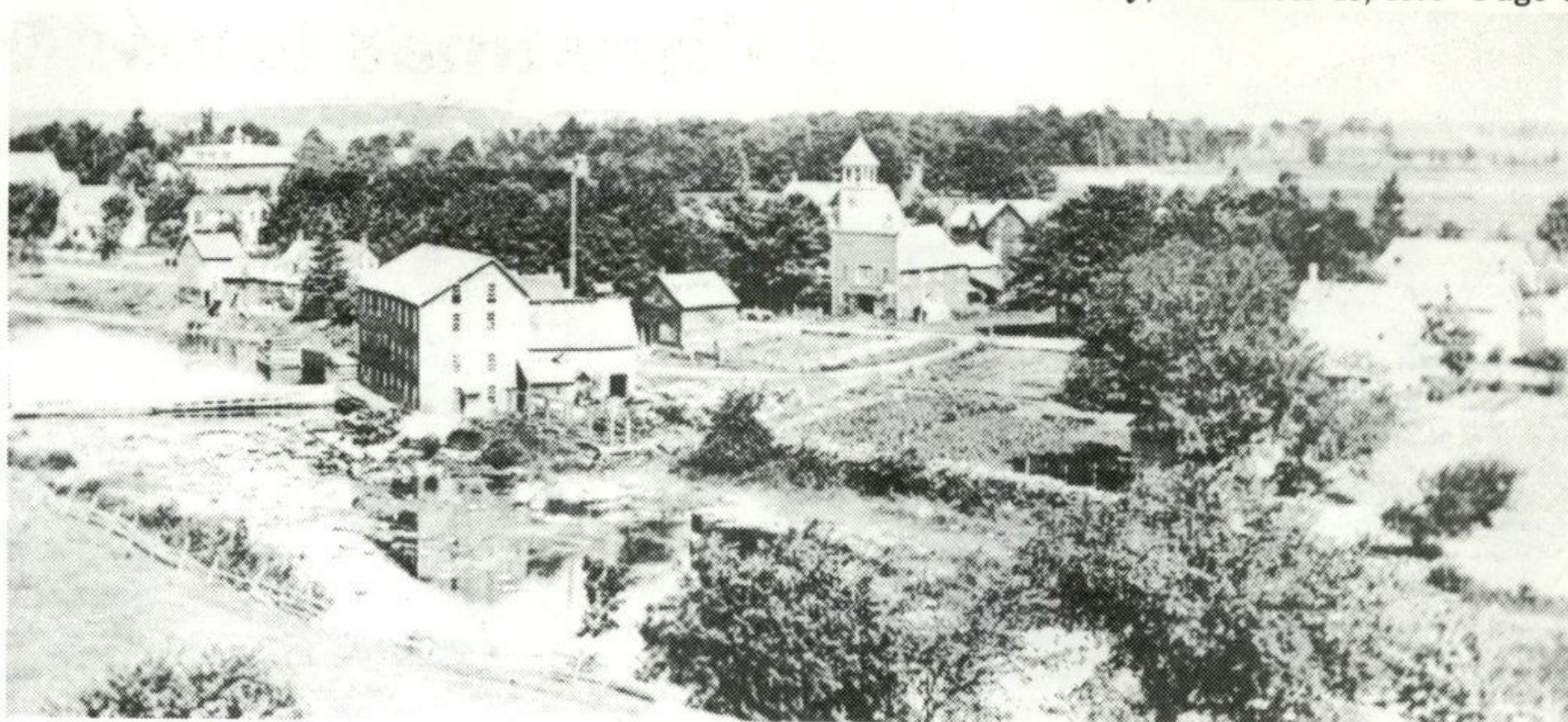
### Branch 372 Royal Canadian Legion

Barrington's Blacksmith Shop. The Anglican Church steeple can be seen in the background. Far left is the upper portion of the Russell Public and Continuation School.

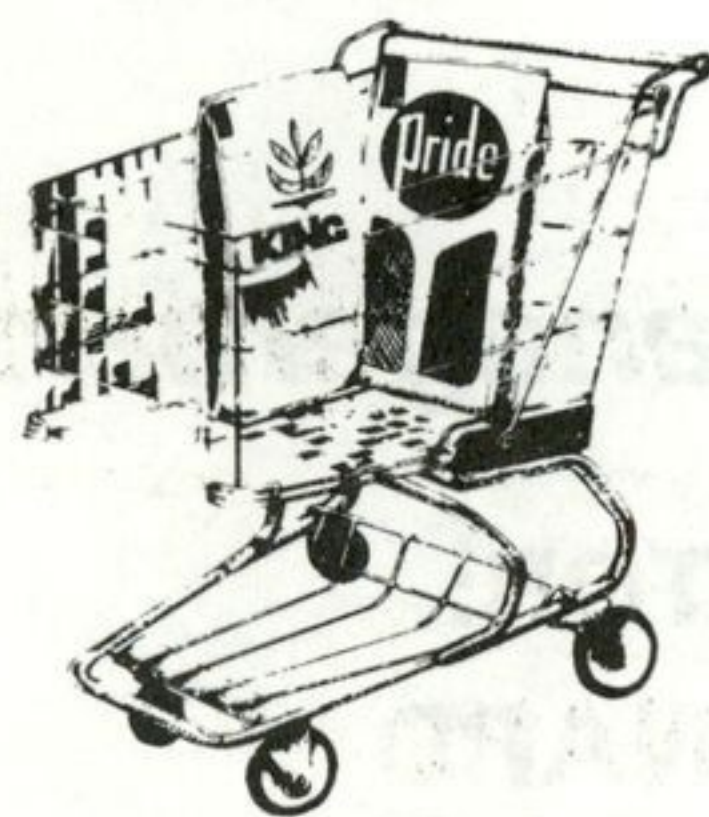
