Gardening

It doesn't take a lot of money to grow a thing of beauty around your home and the beauty thus produced can and will make someone happy. This then may very well be the main reason for growing annuals. The tall flowering type like Climax Marigolds, Zinnias, Cosmos, and many other bulbs such as Dahlias, Dinner plate, medium pom pom. Gladious is a corm that does well in any type of soil. It does require a good amount of water, so daily watering is in order. If planting is made every two weeks from about mid May to the first week of July then your glads are ready for showing. A tiny insect can suck juice from the petals crippling the flower that it cannot open. Before planting soak the corms 4 to 6 hours in a solution of: 1 teaspoon Lysol to one quart of rain water; have your ground prepared; plant immediately.

The 1976 Award winner is "Marjorette", Hollyhock. It is a dwarf growing only two feet tall. It is an excellent back ground.

Designing annual beds is not really difficult. Do not crowd, graduate in height, tall at the back, smaller ones to the front. This allows the plants to be admired and enjoyed. We should not bypass Asters, both perennial and annual. Yet some say we are afraid because of the "Aster Yellows", a disease that has now been bred out of the plant. I suggest you grow them and enjoy them. Gradually begin to have a garden of perennials. Consider Phlox, Peonias, Daylilies, Iris, Daisies, Delphinium, Ueronica, not forgetting Roses. 1976 new perennials introduced for the first time in Spring Jackson and Perkin's catalogues are Blue Glitter, Aster du mosus and Border Jewel (Polygonum affine).

Plan your garden; make a blue print of height and color scheme. Do not crowd and above all balance the house in the centre of the same amount Flowers and Shrubs. A
