Kitchen Tip

Quick and Easy Sauerkraut

Cabbage sliced thinly (2 lb. per quart volume)

1 1/2 sait per ib. (do not reduce)

1 teaspoon spices per lb. (you may use any combination of caraway seed, celery seed, dill seed, mustard seed, juniper berries)

Place cabbage and sait in a crock or plastic container (do not use metal)

Pound with potato masher or wooden mallet until juice covers cabbage. Add spices. Cover with clean cloth, place plate on top and put a weight on this to keep the cabbage under juice. Refrigerate. Change cloth and skim surface whenever needed during fermentation process which takes 4 to 6 weeks.
