
Rosie Darlin'

Recycling is Working Well in Township

Residents of South
Marysburgh can feel proud

1995 you diverted more than
100 tonnes of material from
going into your landfill.
Each collection day in South
Marysburgh about 30 cubic
yards of recyclable material
is collected.

As we become very busy in the summer months residents can help us fit all the material on our trucks by crushing their pop cans, large plastic containers and boxboard material (i.e. detergent and cereal type boxes).

Remember we don't collect on statutory holidays. Additional collection is provided the Monday before and the Monday after the holiday. Please refer to your collection schedule for the dates.

Those residents that wish, may drop off their recycling material at our new depot located at the South Marysburgh landfill.
