

RECYCLING PROCESS

BENEFIT

Newspapers, Magazines and Telephone Directories, Boxboard

De-inked filtered to remove contaminants, processed into new newsprint and new boxboard (cereal and shoe boxes).

Also used to make construction materials, (wallboard, ceiling tiles, cellulose insulation), egg trays, animal bedding and mulching material.

Recycling one tonne saves the equivalent of 19 trees.

Glass Bottles and Jars

Crushed, melted and incorporated into new glass bottles and jars

Reduces stack emissions and requires 30% less energy than glass manufactured from virgin materials.

Aluminum Beverage Cans

Shredded, delaquered and melted. Formed into sheets from which new aluminum cans can be made.

95% energy savings.

Steel and Tin Food Cans

Chemical process separates tin from steel so both metals can be recycled. Steel scrap is used in steel making process.

74% energy savings when steel is made from recycled material instead of virgin ore. Every tonne of steel cans recycled saves 1.36 tonnes of iron ore.

P.E.T. - Clear Soft
Drink Bottles, Clear
Liquid Detergent Containers
and
H.D.P.E. - Opaque
Containers for Milk,
Juice and Water

Ground into flakes or pellets.

Made into fibrefill for quilts and pillows, coat linings, sleeping bags, twine, rope, car bumpers, drill handles, trays, etc..

Textiles
