


Milford Community Friendship Circle Notes

During the business session we were reminded of the Craft show for July 31st and arrangements were made as to what section of the Township road we would pick-up for the trash bash on April 26th.


Jean Burrows thanked the quilters for their faithfulness to the task of providing quilts of which four quilts were given to the Duval family in Picton after their fire.
