Keep up the pressure on the government and the Health Service Restructuring Committee. Make them see the distances that are involved with going out of the county for care. Tell them of the care and support that you are able to give family members and friends who are in a hospital that would be lost if they were in a hospital out of the county. As many of you have, we just finished a week of daily trips to Kingston. That is a long haul and to do it every day while someone was in a hospital for an extended period is very stressful. Even driving to Belleville every day is not easy if it is added to all the other responsibilities one has. But we have the means of transportation so we could do it. There are those who do not have transportation. But you have heard all this and understand. Now it is up to us to make sure that the government understands.
