Before long the dogs will bark to tell me that the oldest grandson from next door and the little fellows from across the road will be out waiting for the school bus. The dogs bark every morning as if they have never seen this happen before.

And speaking of school, I wonder as the teachers are getting ready for their day if they stop in their concern for how badly treated they feel they have become, and realize what a responsibility they have offered themselves to carry out in the shaping and teaching of the children they will be meeting that morning. I suspect that the support for the teachers in their dispute over classroom conditions and hours of teaching would increase in direct proportion to a genuine increase in the teacher's concern for the children entrusted to them and in doing the best they can for these children within the limitation of the resources given to them. Their cause, real or imagined, has so crippled their abilities that I doubt that even the best teachers are not affected by the bitterness and resentment that is felt by them and the children are hostage to this resentment and bitterness. In this age of transplants and implants what appears to be needed is an attitude transplant for the education system as a whole. As my daughter-in-law put it, this government was duly elected on promises to do just
