
Druella Acantha Malvina Cont'd.....



Easy, Cheesy, Cherry Pie 1 pkg. (250 g) cream cheese, softened. Beat until fluffy.

1 can (300 ml) Eagle Brand Milk.
Beat into cheese until well combined.
1/3 cup Realemon lemon juice
1 tsp. vanilla. Stir into above mixture and pour into a 9" graham crust.
Chill 3 hours or until set. Top with desired amount of cherry pie filling from a 19 oz/54 ml. can. Serves 6-8.
Refrigerate leftovers.
