Economic Development people, account for a major part of the economy of the County. Individuals continue to acquire farms, formerly designated as marginal land, for grape growing, at prices never dreamed of in townships like Hillier. These winery and wine growing activities will, according to the Wine Council, attract up to 500,000 more visitors each year who will need lodging and other tourist services.

Is this sort of change good. I sincerely hope so. One part of my friend's comments about the 50's that I would like to see remain the same is the overall attitude of County people both the "old" immigrants who trace themselves back to the U.E.L. and the new immigrants who can only trace themselves back to Adam (if you believe the myth). The friendliness, the wave as you pass, the stopping to let you cross the street, the practical common sense that they will share with you only if you insist, the caring, the absolute generosity to those in need and the furious pride in their County and Country.

I am truly against any changes to these and other virtues found in my County.

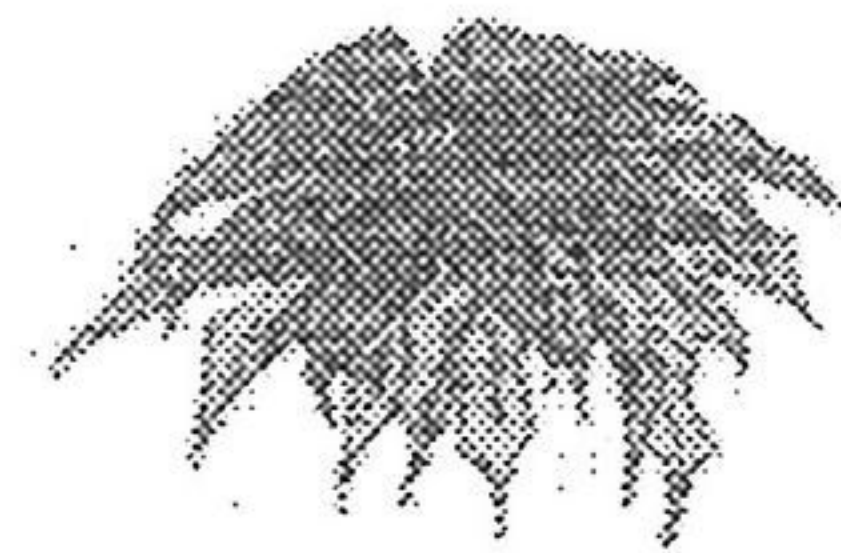
