you are shallow.

"Using a litotes form is sometimes not an ineffective way to get you to shut up",

meaning it is effective in getting the speaker to be quiet.

Sure, you know what an oxymoron is. But can you identify a <u>pleonasm</u>? It's the opposite of oxymoron. It's when two words are redundant. Like free gift, frozen ice, sharp point, or hot fire. So when some self-proclaimed member of the intelligentsia is droning on, babbling endlessly (sort of a pleonasm) on an arcane subject, keep your ears open (pleonasm?) for pleonasms. Then say, "You hardly prove your point by utilizing pleonasms". Even if you don't spot a pleonasm, say it anyway. Chances are the guy is so full of himself that he won't ask what a pleonasm is, and you will have got away with a real zinger.
