The same as me and you.

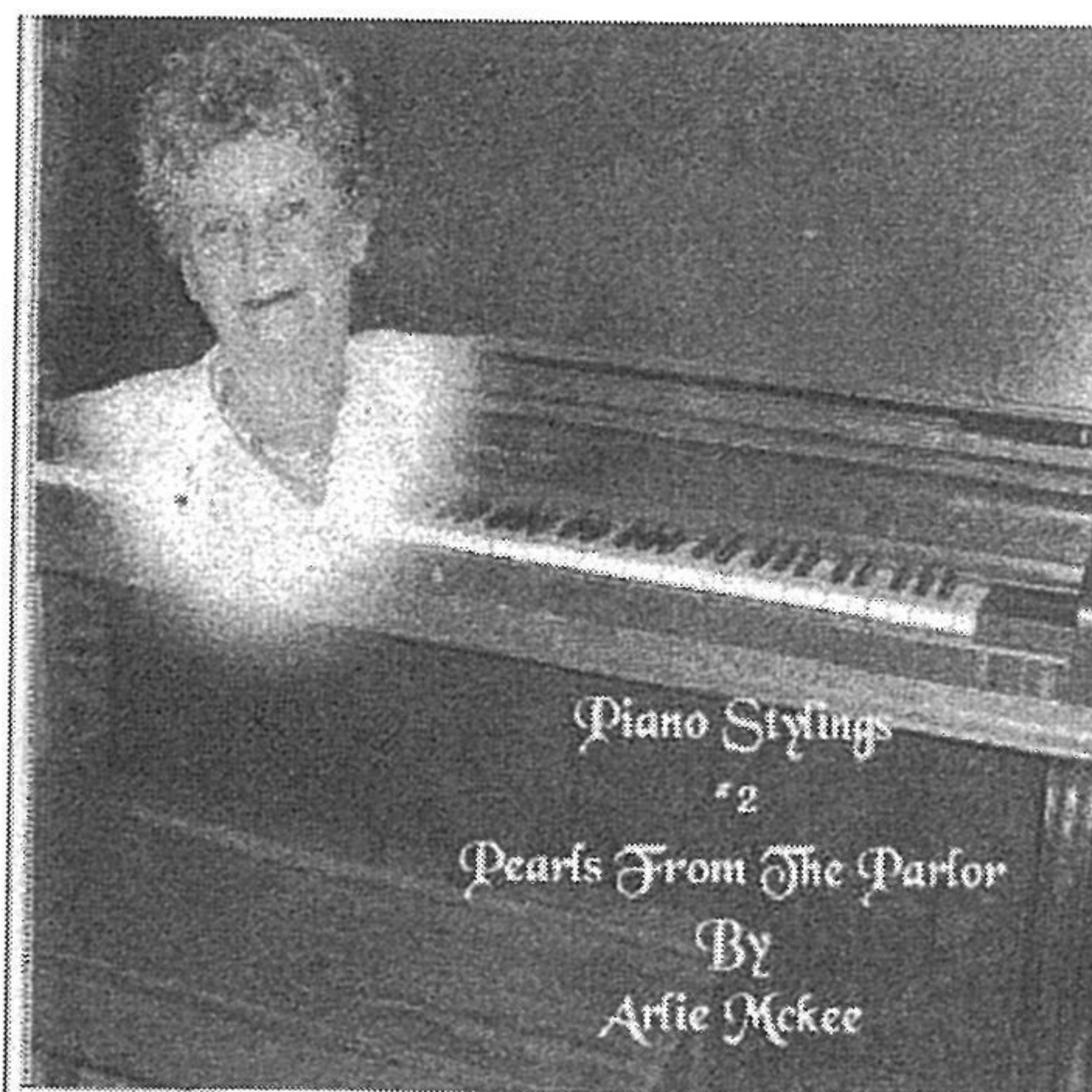
Cole Whattam, he hates them
