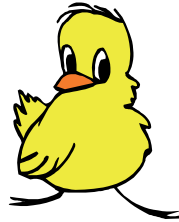


Cancer never sleeps and for one night the "Black Crick Chicks" won't either.

Comment on wpd's White Pines Wind Project by May 10th!

wpd Canada's application for a Renewable Energy Approval (REA) has been deemed complete by the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) and is now closer to approval. South Marysburgh residents and property owners concerned about the impacts of wpd's White Pines wind project can now submit comments to the MOE. The 60-day comment period commenced March 11, 2014 and the deadline for submission of comments is **May 10, 2014**.

Please keep your comments factual and respectful, and comment on one or more negative impacts you are concerned about; include **'EBR 012-1279'** in the subject line:

The most effective comments are those that bring the deficiencies in the project documentation to light.
