

Little Bluff will Re-open in Late Spring, Quinte Conservation Says

Little Bluff Conservation Area on County Road 13, on The South Shore of South Marysburgh will remain closed until late spring, says Quinte Conservation. It plans to make an announcement in mid-May regarding a re-opening schedule.



Treasured locally as a unique, scenic beach surrounded by limestone cliffs, Little Bluff became a popular destination last summer. Quinte Conservation closed Little Bluff to the public after overuse damaged the environmentally significant terrain. Continuing to keep the area closed to public traffic now is allowing time for the land to repair and recover, the environmental protection agency said. During this spring, the agency is undertaking required maintenance and improvement projects to “enhance the visitor experience and safety”.

Residents living around Little Bluff are asked to report trespassers to the OPP.
