Council Activity

Council and all committees have been meeting only via Zoom. In August, we returned to having in-person meetings at the Rotary Hall in Wellington, with the public participating by Zoom.

Highlights for August

- Dealt with the huge misinformation campaign surrounding parking at Lake on the Mountain, by commissioning an engineering study to recommend appropriate measures for the safety of pedestrians and traffic.
- Awarded a major contract for reconstruction of Elk St. and the waterworks beneath it in Picton. Work to be done this fall.
- Enacted a new bylaw regulating cannabis production to protect adjacent landowners.
- Transferred the over \$2M 2020 operating surplus to reserves this will help with next year's budget.
- Supported the effort to protect the Hyatt and MacDonald homes at Sandbanks from demolition.
- Received the CAO's quarterly report which featured results of our seasonal tourism management strategy (mostly good), announcement of the new Planning Application portal where you can see all documents relating to planning projects. A number of major projects planned for South Marysburgh are upcoming – you can track progress here: https://www.thecounty.ca/residents/services/planning/active-planning-applications/
- Received a report from the Picton Town Hall Management Board on progress toward obtaining tenants.


