They continue to work on the schoolhouse wall on Keogh's property where they added another 35 feet. The rock was donated by Nancy Bennet and Joe

Keogh and Ted Fox added tractor time.

The restoration work on the wall on Laura Anthony's property is just about completed, Mr. Stanfield said, with 32 feet added. Rebuilding a

55-foot section of wall on the Margulies/Kirkpatrick property took all year to do. It was the main focus of a Friday morning group.

As always it was a true community effort, Stanfield said, with Paul Creasy assisting with rock sourcing, beverages offered by our host properties and supplemented this year by the Lake on the Mountain Brewing Company.
