

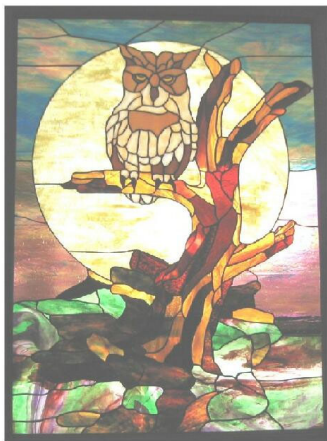

## Stained Glass Artist Opens Local Studio

Peter Doyle, recently establishing in the area, is a skillful creator of beautiful stained glass artwork

Peter was born on June 7, 1957 in Brandon, Manitoba. His father was a career Canadian Armed Forces veteran who served his country for over twenty four years including a posting at CFB Trenton.

He completed high school in 1976 in Kincardine, Ont and began his career at Ontario Hydro at Bruce Nuclear Power Development. Transferred to Pickering in 1986 he spent the remainder of his career in the greater Toronto area.

A newspaper article on stained glass construction was the inspiration for his new career path. The following two years he completed numerous stained glass courses at several established studios in Toronto. He became a member of the stained glass art guild in Toronto in 1999 and was appointed vice president of the guild the following year. He exhibited at their

annual show at the Consilium in Scarborough.

He moved to Picton in April 2005 and opened Pete's Stained Glass from his home studio in July at 168 School House Road. Peter's work was exhibited last year in the Art in the County. Mr Doyle's work is also on exhibit at the Chamber of Commerce office in Picton, the Cherry Valley Restaurant, Bergeron's Animal Sanctuary, Fraser House Retirement Home as well as several county homes. He currently is serving as a director on the Prince Edward County Chamber of Commerce and is also an active member of the Arts Council.

Mr. Doyle is adept at both copper foil and lead construction techniques. Products also include custom stained glass panels, mosaics, patio stones and personalized street addresses. Lessons are available and the cost is reasonable (7
