Quinte Conservation's Hydrogeologist. "Anyone who is curious about how this is done is welcome to attend."

Protecting our groundwater is everyone's responsibility Boone explains, not only that of municipal or other levels of government. "Well water and groundwater protection begins at home. Unused and un-maintained wells can threaten the groundwater that supplies your well or your neighbours' wells."

There is a proper way to plug and seal unused wells. Simply filling an unused well with sand, gravel, stones and debris or garbage will not prevent the flow of contaminated runoff or surface water into the well. A licensed well contractor has the expertise and equipment to do the job properly in accordance with Ministry of the Environment regulations.
