

The story of the life of Jesus Christ – in-

Mark's gospel focuses on the major events of Jesus' adult life: his baptism, his ministry and miracles, and his eventual betrayal, crucifixion and resurrection. # Sustainable Living Symposium Expands to Accommodate Growing Interest!

On Saturday March 29th, 2008 nine partnering non-profit organizations will host the 3rd Annual Sustainable Living Symposium at Loyalist College in Belleville, Ontario.

The event began in 2006 and was held at the local HR Frink Outdoor Education Centre registering full at 100 participants. In 2007 the symposium sold out again at 225. Caroline Zawadzki, Symposium Coordinator says "The Symposium Planning Committee has been busy for months inviting speakers and exhibitors. The event has been so popular the past two years that we have expanded our sessions and increased our enrollments to 350 from last years 225."
