A Video History of Milford

This 72 minute DVD is now available. Written and narrated by Janet Kellough with music by Jeanette Arseneault and Billy Ostrander, it covers the 200 year history and life in Milford. Fifteen citizens have been interviewed over the past eight years and tell their stories of growing up in Milford in the days before hydro as well as more recent community initiatives.
