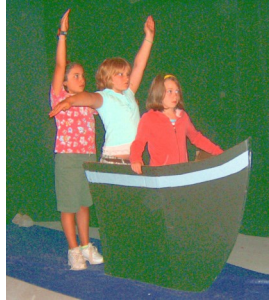


Milford 200 Events Honour the Area's History and Roots

Dr. Bredin:

On August 1st Milford's own Dr. Hautry Bredin was remembered in a unique performance by the cast of this year's Marysburgh Mummies Drama Camp. Twenty-two performers aged 7 and up chronicled the life of the leading citizen in a series of tableaux depicting the dredging of the Black River, the building of Mount Tabor, the medical realities of the time, and the destruction of Dr. Bredin's home by fire. Two performances featured a talent showcase which allowed each performer to shine as an individual.



The evening performance was well attended and received great reviews from the audience. All the children worked well together and should be very proud of their efforts. In conjunction with Jeanette Arsenault, Rick Zimmerman, Graham Parkhurst, Michael Reason, Carol Rutledge, Hugh Cameron and Dan Curtis Thomson, the cast created a modern, fun, comedic and very entertaining look at Milford's history.
