Chronology Of Eisenhower Illnesses

WASHINGTON (AP) - A chronology of former president Dwight D. Eisenhower's major illnesses:

Sept. 24, 1955-First heart attack, in Denver.

June 9, 1956-Surgery for an intestinal inflammation.

Nov. 26, 1957-Illness first described as a "chill," later diagnosed as a "small" stroke.

Nov. 9, 1965-Second heart attack, reported as "major," during vacation at Augusta National Golf Club, followed by a third seizure during recuperation.

Dec. 12, 1966-Surgery for gall bladder removal.

April 29, 1968-Fourth heart attack, at winter home in Palm Desert, Calif., listed as "mild."

June 15, 1968-Fifth heart attack, described as "major," at Walter Reed Army Hospital in late stage of recuperation from fourth attack.

Aug. 6, 1968-Sixth heart attack, a major one, suffered at Walter Reed the morning after he addressed the Republican National Convention by electronie hookup.

Aug. 16, 1968-Seventh heart attack, at Walter Reed, after physicians were encouraged enough about his recovery to stop issuing bulletins on his condition.

Aug. 17, 1968-Rapid irregular action of the heart developed and twice caused unconsciousness but electrical treatment was used and Eisenhower rallied. He remained in the hospital making gradual recovery.

Feb. 23, 1969-Doctors performed abdominal surgery to remove an intestinal obstruction threatening his life.

Feb. 28, 1969-Doctors report pneumonia in right lung. March 15, 1969-Suffers congestive heart failure.

March 24, 1969-Suffers another episode of congestive heart failure.

March 28, 1969-Died.
