

Some prisoners did successfully escape and I believe residing in the district. Some prisoners passed away while in the camps. They were buried at campsites, Some graves were situated near the railroad at Anglers Siding.

Comrads carved elaborate grave markers for them. These markers were bordered with swastikas and the rank, name, birth and death dates were carved into the wood.

After the war, the bodies were moved to the German Prisoner of war section at the Lakehead Riverside cemenetry. The The carved grave markers were put in a Lakehead museum.
